We stepped out in faith and with the unanimous board's approval we listed our multi-family home in Granby Ct. We closed on July 29th and by the grace of God the surplus from the sale will help us move closer to achieving the vision.

Our desire is to build the prototype we believe the Lord has given us which will be replicated to bring back to the Northeast and beyond. North Carolina has in place the community, resources and the zoning to pave the way.
